The Wonder of Water: June 15 - September 30

In the shadow of the Bow Glacier, we find water in all its glory — tumbling waterfalls, slot canyons, blue glaciers, braided streams, and beautiful Bow Lake. Here, you'll see how water and ice have sculpted the Rockies, and find out what water and ice have to teach us: they hold data about everything from past ice ages to today's changing climate.

Golden Larches - A September Pilgrimage: September 17 to 27

During mid to late September, alpine larch trees turn an incredible gold, creating a fabulous fall feeling in the high country. The crush of larch pilgrims from Calgary can be overwhelming, so we like to arrange a trip to a limited access destination — Lake O'Hara. The larches at O'Hara are some of the best and the scenery is... well, sublime. Lake O'Hara is one of the nicest places in the Rockies, packing in everything that makes this place special: glaciers, jewel lakes, steep-sided peaks and high country wildlife.

To go to Lake O'Hara, there is a group limit of 4 or 5 people, plus guide. As well, reservations must be made in advance (see Lake O'Hara information sheet).

The World of Wildflowers - June 15 to August 15
